Our Top Story: BASE 2.0 Applications Closing Soon




Applications Close October 29th

Colorado's Housing Shortfall: An Estimate and Review of Existing Studies

- The housing shortfall for 2023 is estimated to be 106,000 units.
- The shortage peaked in 2019 at 140,000 units.
- Based on the latest population projections, 34,100 units would need to be added each year to maintain the existing shortage over the next ten years.
- Despite recent decreases in the housing shortfall, housing affordability reached a record low in 2023.
